This Workshop is organized by Florence Ninitte and Irene Reginato, Post-doc researchers at the University of Nantes within the ERC Synergy Grant EuQu project ‘The European Qur'an. Islamic Scripture in European Culture and Religion 1150-1850 (EuQu)’;

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Florence NINITTE gained a BA and MA in Romance Studies at the Université catholique de Louvain where she also achieved a PhD in Medieval Languages in December 2016. Her doctoral dissertation, 'La tradition arabo-musulmane dans le Speculum historiale et dans sa traduction française par Jean de Vignay. Enjeux d'un transfert culturel', considers the reception and the integration of Arabic texts about Islam in the Speculum historiale (SH) and in its French translation by Jean de Vignay.



Irene REGINATO has a joint PhD in Romance Philology at Ca 'Foscari University of Venice and Ecole Pratique des Hautes Etudes in Paris. Her PhD dissertation was on the Catalan version of Marco Polo's *Devisement du Monde* and was supervised by Eugenio Burgio and Fabio Zinelli. From 2016 to 2018 she worked on the manuscript tradition of the *Ovide moralisé* as Post Doc researcher at Université Libre de Bruxelles.



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
